ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

Regular Activities:

Independence Day:

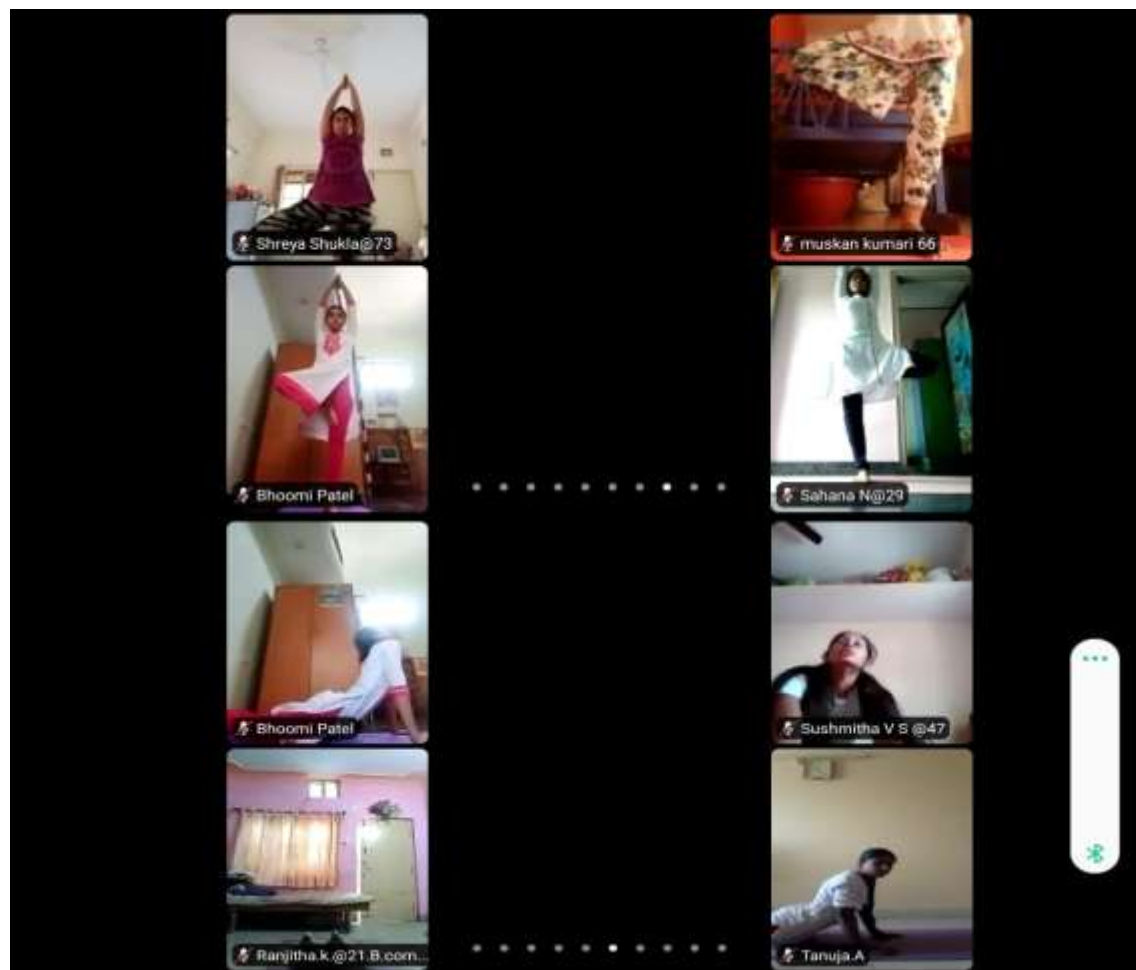
Conducting II Dose Vaccination Drive at College:
